Many patients require surgery and long periods of rehabilitation before release. Our veterinary team works tirelessly to save the lives of these animals and is rewarded by having the privilege of releasing them back into the wild. Key position details & duties

- Responsible for providing wildlife veterinary care, performing clinical procedures, supervising and training hospital staff and volunteers & associated administrative duties.

- 3. Understanding and knowledge of local wildlife species is required.
- 4. Minimum of 2 years' experience in the Veterinary industry.

- 6. Has high level of time management and organisational skills.
- 7. Has a professional approach to duties and standard of personal presentation.
- 8. Have very capable computer skills.
- 9. Holds a current drivers licence.
- 10. Can liaise and communicate in a friendly and effective manner with all key internal department staff including volunteers and external local community groups and associated veterinary contacts.
